The light/candle returns

### Silent prayer

*After the hymn the candle is returned to its place, symbolizing that our redemption is complete, that the Light of Christ overpowers the darkness, and our salvation is assured, our hope in Christ Jesus is not in vain!*

*This Worship Service began on Holy Thursday and continues toward the Easter Resurrection celebration on Sunday morning. The celebration of the holy three days of Christ's Passover is called the “Triduum” (pronounced: trij-oo-um).*

## **Service of Tenebrae**

To impress upon the minds and hearts of believers the awful consequence of sin and the magnitude of the Savior's sacrifice, the ancient Church held a special service in the last days of Holy Week, called "Tenebrae". The word means "shadow" or "darkness". The observation of Good Friday should **not** be seen as a funeral for Jesus, but rather a time of repentance over sin and restrained joy in salvation in Jesus, and therefore is also a time of praise. Music is kept to a minimum, but not silenced. The death of Jesus was for the punishment of sin. By His suffering and death we have been forgiven of all sin. He saved us from eternal condemnation. He Who died was raised for us and His resurrection is celebrated on Easter Sunday and His resurrection underlies every Sunday worship service.

Tenebrae is a ceremonial service of extinguishing in succession the candles in the church. As the candles are extinguished, they symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. They also portray the fading light of the world as Christ was departing from it, reminding us of the events that led to utter darkness on Good Friday.

**Tonight we begin and end in silence.** Toward the end of tonight's service the removal of the seventh candle symbolizes the death of Jesus the Christ. The strepitus (the loud noise [slamming door]) has been seen as symbolic of the soldiers' scourging of Jesus, or the earthquake at Christ's death, or the shutting of the tomb. The return of the candle symbolizes the resurrection and the assurance that Jesus is with us always and that He will return on the Last Day. This candle remains lit to symbolize that even in the midst of death and darkness, the forces of hell shall never prevail against the Light of Christ. There is no invocation or benediction since this is part of the Triduum Service began Maundy Thursday (yesterday) and is completed on Easter.
