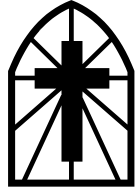

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

No Defending *This* Rebellion!

Two hundred forty-five years ago today (that's almost 250!), the signers of the Declaration of Independence knew what they were doing: they were rebelling against the authorities that Romans 13 says God established and placed over them. And they knew they owed the world an explanation: "When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation." They then give a lengthy list of tyrannies King George III of England had inflicted on them: "He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good. . . . He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people. . . . He has obstructed the Administration of Justice. . . . He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone" and so on and so on and so on. So there! Reasons the Founding Fathers felt justified declaring independence. We could argue whether we were right to rebel like that or not, but we celebrate it every year, and God has certainly rained countless blessings down on our country ever since.

We all make long, long lists of reasons we just had to rebel against God by this sin here or that sin there—the way every American does, the way Israelites in Ezekiel's day did (Ezek 2:3), and the way every other citizen of the world in every age has been doing since the beginning. They won't wash; we've got no case. You can't defend this rebellion. God's no tyrant. He never does us anything but good. Whether these United States will confess or not, let us as God's people confess our rebellions, our sins, to him. Because he is merciful, and in Christ Jesus, his declaration is always forgiveness.

FROM THE ELDER'S

“Summertime, summertime, sum sum summertime...”

from the Elders

With its greatest availability of light, the longest day of 2021 reached its peak on Father's Day. The trees have performed their annual makeover with leaves now beautifully green. Field crops appear to grow taller overnight. Vegetable gardens everywhere are springing forth with the anticipation of healthy goodness. And...it has been hot! Summer is here. *“You have fixed all the boundaries of the earth; you have made summer and winter.”* (Psalm 74:17 ESV)

A change of season can bring transformation to our lives as well. What will this summer and the upcoming autumn bring? Will the changing seasons bring immeasurable joy for many years to come? Which season ahead will bring an element of grief or sorrow? Although answers to those questions are unknown to us now, every season can and does bring opportunity to grow in our faith, set or redefine goals, and seek God's purpose and will according to His Word – all while understanding that not every day will be viewed as ideal.

Our warm, bright, and lush summer season appreciated now also brings an abundance of weeds to deal with. They choke out the good in our lives. Winters's cold, long, dark nights can leave us restless or lethargic. Spring, and all seasons for that matter, can bring strong, crippling storms that may prove destructive. Fall ushers in its damp chill, the beginning of a host of seasonal illnesses, and the all too busy, school/sports attention level that often compromises time management decisions for busy families. *“While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease.”* (Genesis 8:22 ESV)

But we should not let a change of season bring worries. Nor should we continue hoping for a change in season simply because it is not in our best interest for a particular occasion or best suited for our all-around perfect, self-regulated climate. Rather, the Bible comforts us in knowing that God our Creator ordained each of our four seasons – measured out to us as He reasons. *“It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority.”* (Acts 1:7 ESV)

Our spiritual seasons are somewhat similar. God wants us to see the beauty and blessings within our lives but also trust Him through the difficult, cloudy parts. Our seasons change, but He does not! The world purely rests in the hands of the One who created it. Because of this we can walk boldly through each season because we know He promises to equip, guide, and love us despite our worldly temperature.

Flipping the pages in our calendar, we also see that shifting seasons are very dependable. God's consistency should remind us of His sovereign promises, His creative power, and His timetable. God created seasons and they will last as long as the earth remains. *“He changes times and seasons...”* (Daniel 2:21a ESV)

On a here-and-now note: God continues to provide occasion to build upon our faith with regular worship at St. John. Together we are reminded of what he provides in the gift of His Son Jesus. He has reached out and taken our hand to walk side-by-side with Him, whether in awe along a plush, comfortable path or stumbling over a rocky, degraded hillside. We need to hear it regularly from God's Word, and so do our children! He has planned for the cycles of our existence and knows the timing of each one – beginning to end. So, bring yourself and your family to Worship this summer and be watchful at how God faithfully works throughout your life, in every season.

Our Heavenly Father does not take a vacation from you! In Christ, He continuously and abundantly bestows His grace upon us – every day, in every way. *“Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change.”* (James 1:17 ESV)
