In 1893 the Pastor was paid \$400 a year plus a share in the 40 acres; the organist in 1900 was voted a salary of \$15 a year; the janitor received \$12 a year; and a vacancy Pastor at that time received \$10 for four month's work. In 1880 the first organ was purchased for \$200.
