Building of our current church building began on April 4, 1911 and was dedicated on September 17,1911. The old church was converted to a school house. A farewell service was held in the old building, and then the congregation proceeded in procession to the new one, singing a German hymn. The bell rang continuously until all were seated. Morning and afternoon sermons were preached in the German language.
