



Holy Gospel: Luke 10:1–10

¹ After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. ² And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³ Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace be to this house!’ ⁶ And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. ⁷ And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. ⁸ Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. ⁹ Heal the sick in it and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ ¹⁰ But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, ¹¹ ‘Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.’ ¹² I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

¹³ “Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. ¹⁴ But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. ¹⁵ And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.

¹⁶ “The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me.”

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST JULY 3, 2022

WE WARMLY WELCOME YOU TO OUR WORSHIP SERVICE ON THE FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST. *The Lord Grants Peace and Life to His Church.* The Lord restores Jerusalem, His Church, because she is the mother of His children, whom He comforts “*as one whom his mother comforts*” (Is. 66:13). We are “*satisfied from her consoling breast*” with the pure milk of the Word, and we “*drink deeply with delight from her glorious abundance*” (Is. 66:11). The messengers of Christ bestow such gifts upon His

Church. For He sends them out “*as lambs in the midst of wolves*” (Luke 10:3), bearing in their bodies the sacrifice of His cross, by which “*the kingdom of God has come near*” (Luke 10:9, 11). Wherever He enters in with this Gospel, Satan is cast out and falls “*like lightning from heaven*” (Luke 10:18). Thus, we do not “*boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ*” (Gal. 6:14). Rejoicing in this Gospel, we “*bear one another’s burdens*” in love, according to “*the law of Christ*” (Gal. 6:2). The readings today are as follows: the Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 66:10-14, the Epistle

Reading is Galatians 6:1-10, 14-18, and the Holy Gospel Reading is Luke 10:1-20. Today’s text is from Galatians 6:6-10. The message from God’s word is “*Sow Good---Reap Good*”.

HOLY COMMUNION...Luther found his deepest treasure in the forgiveness of sins and called it “the sun around which all other doctrines revolve like planets”.
